Vulnerable persons or those with underlying health conditions	*All persons attending* a motocross practice event who are vulnerable or have underlying health issues risk becoming seriously ill due to contact with Covid-19	<ul> <li>Individuals who are classed as "Clinically extremely vulnerable" or those living with someone who is "clinically extremely vulnerable" individuals should not attend the motocross event</li> </ul>				
Transmission of virus from a person displaying the symptoms of Covid-19	*All persons attending* a motocross practice event risk contracting Covid-19	<ul> <li>Individuals who are displaying symptoms (namely high temperature or a new, continuous cough) should not attend the motocross event.</li> <li>If an individual starts to display the symptoms at an event, they must leave as soon as is possible and the organiser must implement a cleaning and disinfection protocol</li> <li>Signs will be displayed at the entrance advising persons with the symptoms not to enter the event</li> <li>Any person displaying symptoms will be respectfully asked to leave</li> </ul>				
Social Distancing	*All persons attending* a motocross practice event risk contracting Covid-19 through physical contact, aerial transmission or deliberate acts if social distancing requirements are not followed	<ul> <li>Organisers will follow current Government Regulations /ACU instruction in relation to social distancing (currently 2m+). This will need to be considered and applied to all aspects of the event - see below 'Motocross Specific Considerations'</li> <li>Competitor and spectator numbers may need to be reduced to achieve social distancing requirements</li> <li>The wearing of PPE such as face masks is advisable where social distancing cannot be maintained</li> </ul>				
Handwashing & General Hygiene Arrangements	*All persons attending* a motocross practice event risk contracting Covid-19 through infrequent / poor handwashing	<ul> <li>Regular handwashing / sanitising is advised in accordance with Government / ACU advice</li> <li>Wherever possible organisers are to make public handwashing / sanitising facilities available</li> <li>Toilet facilities will be provided with additional external hand sanitising facilities for public use prior to entry</li> <li>Organisers will provide / make available hand sanitiser for all persons working at the event</li> </ul>				
Covid-19 Hazard Warning Information		<ul> <li>Covid-19 hazard warning information to be added to event paperwork and entrance signage - persons with symptoms told to stay away, social distancing requirements of 2m+, regular handwashing / sanitising, wearing of PPE (masks and gloves) advised</li> </ul>				
Travelling	Organisers risk contracting Covid-19 whilst travelling to and from a motocross practice event	<ul> <li>Travel to and from the circuit/venue would be dependent on current UK Government advice / guidance in place at the time</li> <li>Only one person should travel in the vehicle, unless individuals are from the same household, then these persons may travel together</li> </ul>

Working Parties	Organisers risk contracting Covid-19 whilst setting up / clearing away a motocross practice event	<ul> <li>Working parties will involve small numbers of people who will follow social distancing requirements of 2m+</li> <li>Organisers will strictly follow Government guidance in relation to self isolation where Covid-19 symptoms are present - any organising members with symptoms will stay at home - see general arrangements</li> <li>Individuals notified as being in the 'Clinically extremely vulnerable' category will not attend - see general arrangements</li> <li>Hand washing facilities / hand sanitiser will be made available and regular hand washing practices will be followed</li> <li>Protective gloves and face masks will be worn</li> <li>Organisers will travel to and from working parties in separate vehicles - see general considerations above</li> </ul>				
Spectator Admission - Parking and Viewing Areas	Spectators risk contracting Covid-19 through contact with people entering the event. This can be from physical contact, aerial transmission or deliberate acts of aggression	<ul> <li>Spectators can be admitted to ACU Permitted events if individual Organisers feel confident within themselves that they are content to allow spectators into their event and that they have the capability / space at the venue which allows Social Distancing Measures to safely take place. Organisers must ensure the following:</li> <li>A Risk Assessment has been put in place to ensure control measures have been considered to mitigate the risk of infection (as outlined in the Safety Assessment Statement above, this risk assessment may be used provided the Organiser accepts responsibility and puts in place the control measures outlined in this document.</li> <li>The Local Authority is contacted to inform them of the intent to hold an ACU permitted event and that it is intended to allow spectators into the venue and to confirm that suitable control measures have been put in place to ensure the venue is Covid-19 Secure as per the guidance / advice issued by the UK Government and the Auto-Cycle Union.</li> <li>The Landowner is content for the event to take place and the landowner is content that spectators will be admitted to the event.</li> <li>A Track and Trace method is put in place to record details of spectators being admitted to the event. There is not a requirement to take details of every individual, based on the fact that any other persons in the vehicle / pillion passenger are from the same household / support bubble, but details required are: Name, postcode / house number. Mobile number and/or email address.</li> <li>Spectator groups to be no larger than six in a group. Face coverings to be worn as appropriate, particularly when queuing to use the toilet facilities or food/beverage outlets.</li> <li>The Paddock should be segregated, and no access allowed to Spectators.</li> </ul>

	Riders and organisers risk contracting Covid-19 through direct contact or aerial transmission at practice events	<ul> <li>Subject to social distancing requirements, there is no restriction on the number of Riders to be accepted and it is the responsibility of the Organising Club to put in place control measures that are suitable and sufficient which accord to current and future Government restrictions.</li> <li>Practice organisers must comply with current Government social distancing guidelines of 2m+</li> <li>No mass starts - riders will be held in a socially distanced manner in their respective class before being allowed onto the track with a minimum length of start straight between each person</li> </ul>				
	Motorcycles that have broken down will need to be recovered back to the paddock from the track.	<ul> <li>Rider/mechanic/rider's assistant only to recover machine with authority from the Clerk of the Course</li> </ul>				

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Fallen Riders	Fallen riders may require assistance which would bring them into close contact with organisers / medical staff. Organisers and medical staff risk contracting Covid-19 through direct contact or aerial transmission when assisting fallen riders	<ul> <li>Only the Clerk of the Course / Officials with medical support (if required) will attend to fallen riders. Full PPE will be worn (Mask / Gloves) whilst in attendance and discarded after use.</li> <li>No marshals are to assist and picker uppers will be allowed to support the Auto &amp; 65cc classses PPE must be worn (Mask / Gloves) whilst assisting and discarded after use.</li> </ul>				
Track Maintenance	Track staff risk contracting Covid-19 through the shared use of equipment such as tractors	<ul> <li>Where applicable Track staff will not share/swop tractors / equipment etc. to reduce the possibility of cross-contamination</li> <li>Where applicable Track staff will wear appopriate PPE and equipment should be sanitised before use</li> </ul>

Food & Beverages	Temporary catering facilities are employed to provide take away food and beverages for those attending the event.	<ul> <li>Subject to UK Government advice food vendors will only provide a take away service and operate strict social distancing protocols - individual condements are to be provided</li> <li>Where food vendors are not permitted, Riders / Organisers etc. should provide their own food / beverages for the duration of the event.</li> </ul>				
Trade Stands	Trade stands will supply goods and services to riders and those attending the event.	<ul> <li>Trade stands are permitted and must follow all government advice and social distancing measurers.</li> <li>Riders should provide their own spares / equipment as required to participate at the event.</li> </ul>
