**Start:** Hound Tor, Widecombe in the Moor, Nr Ashburton, Devon, TQ13 7TS. The first rider will start at 9:31 and then one rider every minute.

The course: Will be 30 sections over approximately 25 miles and include the use of public roads, the public highway will be used: it is the rider's responsibility to ensure that both his machine and himself are fully legal for the purpose.

- 1. This event will use the public highway to link various events on private land.
- 2. The onus will be on the competitor to find their own route.
- 3. There will be no time constraints or penalties used.
- 4. On the public highway, merit attaches to a competitors performance, only in relation to good road behaviour and compliance with the Highway Code, in accordance with the Motor Vehicles [Competitions and Trials] Regulations 1969 Reg 5 [C]. Anyone in breach of these regulations will be disqualified.
